



La Via Campesina is an international social movement of peasants, small farmers, farm workers, indigenous peoples, fisherfolk, and pastoralist nomads from 79 countries. La Via Campesina created the concept of “food sovereignty” as an alternative to the “food security” model supported by the World Bank and Food and Agriculture Organization.

California native **Nils McCune**, a student and researcher in agroecology, will discuss La Via Campesina’s use of agroecological peasant farming as the model for the world’s people and a real alternative to agribusiness. In particular, Nils will discuss the work of constructing the Latin American Institute of Agroecology in Nicaragua which is based in peasant-to-peasant methodology, gender equality, dialogue, and the rescue of historical memory.

Nils McCune (center) has worked in sustainable farming in California, Cuba, and Mexico. He currently lives and works in Nicaragua with La Via Campesina’s network of agroecology schools.
